


Innovative Learning Environment Network Professional Learning Days

The focus of our day was to:

- build collective knowledge around using the voices of our students to guide the learning.
 - materials, using documentation to guide learning, inquiry-based learning, place-conscious learning, creating cultures of thinking in numeracy, and building community.
- connect educators across the district to create an inclusive innovative learning environments network.

 - The focus will be to explore ways to shift the elements of the pedagogical core to empower students to be at the center of their learning.
